Department of Transitional Assistance (Falmouth)

The Massachusetts Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA), formerly known as the Department of Public Welfare, is the state agency responsible for administering public assistance programs for needy citizens of the Commonwealth. DTA provides financial and food stamp services to individuals and families that meet certain financial and categorical requirements. Additional services are provided to those individuals and families that meet program eligibility for the purpose of becoming self-sufficient. Also provide indigent funeral and burial expense not exceeding eleven hundred dollars provided that the expense does not exceed \$1500.00 Death benefits and other resources must be explored before funeral and burial expenses are authorized. DTA currently provides services to over 360,000 income-eligible families and individuals across the state. Because DTA emphasizes temporary assistance, recipients are encouraged to participate in education, training and job search activities which promote responsibility and self-sufficiency. The Department has developed and continues to refine case management strategies to assist families transitioning from welfare to work. The standards for determining eligibility and the amount of assistance are established on an objective and equitable basis. Services include: Transitional Housing/Shelter, TANF, and Food Stamps.

To participate in DTA funded Employment Services Programs individuals must be eligible recipients with an approved DTA referral.
