HUD Annual Point in Time Count of the Homeless - January 28, 2020**

Data is based on an unduplicated count. Unsheltered persons must meet the HUD definition - residing in a place not meant for human habitation, such as cars, parks, encampments, abandoned buildings, or on the street. Those in shelter are either residing in Emergency Shelter or residing in a motel or hospitality setting paid for by an organization. Transitional Housing is meant to be temporary with a two-year limit.

\*The overall decrease in total homeless persons may be attributable in part to the removal of a project from HMIS that had been previously (and incorrectly) entered as a Family Emergency Shelter. This classification was recognized as being inaccurate, the participants could not be considered homeless, and the project and its participants were removed from HMIS and eliminated from the homeless population count.
